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

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

I am greatly delighted to learn that Pakistan Tanners Association is publishing its Annual Report for the year 2023-24 containing all the major activities and salient features of the Association.



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FOREWORD

The global economic crisis and stagnant market recession put a negative impact on the international leather industry, in particular. Pakistan is no exception to it. Despite having ample potential, natural and human resources including sufficient stock of raw materials, the leather industry of Pakistan could not make progress and resultantly its exports is gradually decreasing.

Aftermath of pandemic Covid-19, the leather industry of Pakistan suddenly hit the recent Russian – Ukraine War, political un-certainty in the country and further depreciation in Pak Rupees badly impacted the growth of leather industry. High rate of Gas & power is also added woes to make Pakistan Leather and Leather Products completely out of competition in the International Market.

It's a critical time for Leather Sector, needs proactive approach of the Government to encourage exporters and adopt positive measures. But the Government taken the harsh decision and unveiled an "Unjust Federal Budget 2024-25" on IMF's directions, instead of consulting the major stakeholders of the country who are the backbone to earn the foreign exchange for the national kitty and keen honestly to run the country on right track, but all in vain, ALAS! Resultantly in implementation of Federal Budget 2024-25, the exporters now paid standard Corporate Tax Rate of 29 percent plus applicable Super Tax, instead of the previous one percent tax on export turnover as a result of recent shift from Final Tax Regime (FTR) to the Normal Tax Regime (NTR). The exporters are stuck in a vortex due to multiple taxes imposed in recent Budget and nearly to shut down their business.

At last but not least, the exporters of leather industry are optimistic to enhance the country's exports at the desired extent if the government would take remedial measures and to adopt business friendly policies

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

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A gist of MOU signed between CLIA & PTA is furnished hereunder:

Memorandum of Understanding between China Leather Industry Association (CLIA) & Pakistan Tanners' Association (PTA) 中国皮革协会(CLIA)与巴基斯坦制革协会(PTA)合作备忘录

This Memorandum and Understanding (MOU) is made and entered into on this 3rd day of September, 2024 between China Leather Industry Association (CLIA), Beijing, China AND Pakistan Tanners Association, Karachi — Pakistan with exclusive objectives for making close coordination/liaison between the two major recognized Organizations in China and Pakistan for playing more effective role in bridging the gap between the two major export oriented Industries of both countries (China & Pakistan) to extend the opportunities to both organizations members for the promotion of bilateral trade relations specially after execution of 2nd Free Trade Agreement already made & taken place/effective between the two brother countries for flourishing the business activities with relaxation in duties at both ends. The MOU would have the following fundamental objectives for exploration/expansion in more close coordination between CLIA & PTA:

- d) Create Hotline/Direct communication Module between CLIA & PTA to be more closure interaction frequently with persistent:

- e) To extend facilitation for recommendation of joint ventures between Pakistan and Chinese Leather industries to take advantage of Pakistan's free duty exports access to USA and GSP+ to Europe: 促进巴基斯坦和中国皮革行业建立合资企业,以利用巴基斯坦向美国出口免关税和向欧洲出口 GSP+的优惠待遇;
- f) To extend cooperation/assistance in arranging Visa's for the members to enable to make visit to China or to Pakistan by the member exporters of both organisations as per their convenience for ties/joint ventures/collaborations as elaborated hereunder:

 - (ii) On reciprocate basis, PTA would extend its maximum possible cooperation on CLIA's recommendation thru
 Online (E-Visa for Pakistan) which is already in progress at Pakistan for Chinese Businessmen thru
 prescribed portal of NADRA;

I was persistently in touch with the Italian Tanners Association and Lineapelle Organizer as well since 2023 for promotion of finest quality of Pakistani Leather and Leather Products in the Italian market and approached for execution of a Memorandum of Understanding MOU) between both the Leather Associations. Now our Association has achieved another milestone for executing a MOU between Italian Tanners Association (UNIC), Shoe Association (ASSOCALZATURIFICI), ASSOMAC and the Pakistan Tanners Association (PTA).

Export Performance

Due to internal market situation in the aftermath of Ukraine war, and strict IMF conditionalities, appreciation of US\$, Political uncertainty and cost of doing business resulted in the withdrawal of incentives / support schemes by the Government i.e. Regionally Competitive Energy Tariff (RCET) and discontinuation of DLTL Scheme @5% for Finished Leather affected the momentum of increasing exports in FY 2023-24 and onward. As a result, the export of Leather Sector drastically dropped by 8.87% % during the current financial Year July-June 2023-24 and stood at US\$ 808.422 Million as compared to exports of Last year's FY July-June 2022-23 at US \$ 887.104 Million which adversely impacted to lose their global competitiveness too.

I would like to appreciate our member exporters who worked hard despite facing the multiple challenges during the year and played their pivotal role for earning foreign exchange for the country. I extend my congratulations to all the Leather Exporters for delivering their excellent performance for the Leather Industry. I would like to mention hereunder TOP TEN PTA Leather Exporters and would like to congratulate all of them and specially congratulate Mr. Naeem Akhtar of M/s. H. Sadar Ali Akhtar Ali for achieving 1st Position amongst the Leather Exporters.

ACHIEVEMENTS

It has certainly challenging times, but I am really happy with what we have achieved together, this past year. With collective efforts, constant follow-up and approach of my team of Central Executive Committee as well as PTA Central Secretariat, we have achieved following important tasks in my tenure for the leather industry.

- * 16-PTA member Exporters concerned received subsidy directly through cheque from TDAP after scrutiny & verification of their claims for Lab Testing of Finished Leather for the period effective from 18.03.2021 onward as approved by EDF. Out of approved fund of Rs.60 Million, TDAP released so far total amount of Rs.30,841,761/- on account of Lab testing Claims of Claimants concerned and Rs.1,113,028/- Auditor Fee as hired for services for scrutiny of claims.
- * TDAP approved PTA's proposal for increase in Subsidy for International Leather Fairs from 40% to 70% for participation of PTA's member exporters in Leather Fairs & Exhibition around the globe for promotion of Pakistani Leather Industry in particular and to earn more foreign exchange for the country.

Now there is No single pendency at TDAP for the subsidies so far (as on 31.07.2024)

After issuance of FBR's Sales Tax Order (STGO Order # 9 of 2023 dated 15.03.2023) notified list of 717 items on which Input Tax adjustment not allowed to five export oriented sector including Leather Sector wherein HS Codes including tanning chemicals and various items of Leather Sector put in Negative List, PTA sent proposal to FBR for exclusion of relevant HS Codes of Leather Industry from Negative List for the facilitation of exporters of Leather Industry.

On PTA's persistent follow-up, the FBR moved 3-HS Codes i.e. 2519, 3909 & 7306 from the Negative List to Positive List vide FBR letter # 1(1)Secy-ST-Ops/2022/789 dated 12.01.2024 to get the eligibility for refund of sales tax. PTA is still striving hard to get inclusion of remaining H.S. codes as per list which has already been submitted to FBR for favourable consideration.

SALIENT FEATURES OF THE FEDERAL BUDGET 2024-25

I would like to mention hereunder the salient Features of the Federal Budget 2024-25:

CUSTOMS ACT 1969

REVIEW OF REGULATORY (RD) REGIME:

01. Levy / increase of RD on certain items to encouraging local manufacturing.

CUSTOM DUTY

The Government imposed under SRO 929(I)/2024 dated 30th June'2024 ACD on import of goods specified in the First Schedule at the rate of:

(i) Two percent (2%) on goods under tariff slabs 0%, 3% and 11% and imported under SRO 655(I)/2006 and 656(I)/2006 both dated 5th June 2006.

Under First Schedule of the Customs Act, there is 0% Custom Duty on Raw Hides & Skins of Goat, Sheep, Cow Buffalo, Wetblue, split and Finished Leather.

2% ACD imposed on Tanning Chemicals falling under tariff Slab of 0% CD: 2830.1010 (Sodium Sulphide), 2830.1090(Sodium Hydrosulphide), 2915.1210 (Sodium Formate), 3202.1000(Synthetic Organic substance), 3808.9220(Fungicides), Ammonium sulphate, Mimosa, Quebracho, Tara powder, Magnesium oxcide, Bacteriacides ,Chestnut, Sarugan w 919, RPU 075, MELIO PROMUL 67 B, MELIO PROMUL 53B, RPU K050, SARPUR 3908, RU 22537, AQUADER MATT 200, BAYDER BOTTOM ELW, Roda pur 8103, Hm-51-251, Melio WF 5230, Aquaderm Additive XF, 2% ACD imposed on Spare parts if imported without machinery.

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- (ii) Four percent (4%) on goods falling under tariff Slab of 16% CD 3204.1200 (Acid Dyes), 3204.1400 (Direct Dyes), 3202.9010 (Tanning Sub, Chromium Sulphate)
 - I. Six percent (6%) on goods falling under tariff Slab of 20% CD 3210.0020 (Pigments) II. Seven percent (7%) on goods falling under tariff Slab of 30% CD.

III. 0% ACD if imported under 5th Schedule

Tanning Chemicals 3403.1110 (Of kind used in Leather or like industry) 3403.9110 (Fat Liquors), 3809.9300(Binders), 2915.1100(Formic Acid)

0% ACD if import of Plant and Machinery used in manufacturing or Production of goods as is classifiable under Chapter 84 & 85 to the **First Schedule to the Customs Act, 1969** (IV of 1969)

SALES TAX ACT 1990

- 1. Withdrawal of various exemptions/zero rating and reduced/fixed rates.
- 2. Enhancement in reduced rate of sales tax from 15% to 18% on supplies made by the POS retailers dealing in leather and textile products.
- 3. Rate of default surcharge is to be aligned with the SBP's policy rate of KIBOR plus 3%.

INCOME TAX ORDINANCE 2001

REVENUE MEASURES:

1. PERSONAL INCOME TAX

The tax rates for non-salaried individuals and associations of persons and salaried individuals have changed. There is no income if annual income is up to Rs.600,000. Beyond this threshold, tax rates for non-salaried individuals have five taxable slabs with progressive tax rates ranging from 15% to 45%. For salaried individuals, beyond the threshold of Rs.600,000 per annum, there are five taxable slabs ranging from 5% to 35%.

2. DIVIDEND INCOME FROM MUTUAL FUNDS

Dividend income from mutual funds is taxed @ 15% at present. However, in order to reduce the arbitrage between individual persons deriving income from profit on debt and persons earning dividend income from mutual funds deriving income from profit on debt, it is proposed that rate of dividend derived from a mutual fund which earns 50% or more of its income from profit on debt be enhanced from 15% to 25%.

3. NORMAL INCOME TAX ON EXPORT INCOME:

At present, persons deriving income from exports have to pay 1% tax on their export proceeds which is final tax. On the principle of horizontal equity that taxpayers with equal income should pay equal tax, it is proposed income from exports be subjected to normal rates with one percent tax collection on their export proceeds be treated as minimum tax.

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The exporters will now be subject to the standard corporate tax rate of 29 percent plus applicable Super Tax, instead of the previous one percent tax on export turnover.

In Normal Tax Regime full 10% Super Tax will be applied on profit, this means total tax will be 29% + 10% = 39%

4. REDUCED RATE CERTIFICATE IN LIEU OF EXEMPTION CERTIFICATE:

The facility of exemption from withholding tax by issuing an exemption certificate on supply of goods and for certain other transactions is being converted into a reduced rate certificate for ensuring documentation of the value chain.

5. BROADENING THE SCOPE OF WITHHOLDING TAX ON SUPPLY CHAIN AND SUBSTANTIALLY ENHANCING NON-FILER RATES FOR DISTRIBUTORS, DEALERS, WHOLESALERS AND RETAILERS:

At present, advance tax is collected on sale to dealers, distributors, wholesalers and retailers of certain specified sectors. Now it is proposed that such tax will be collected from all sectors of the economy so that it is expanded to the entire supply chain comprising all distributors, wholesalers, dealers and retailers with the aim to document the traders.

Further, the rate for non-filers for dealers, distributors, wholesalers is being **enhanced** from 0.2% to 2% and for retailer non-filers from 1% to 2.5% so that with the purpose of documentation of traders and to discourage non-filing.

6. Minimum Value for Income Tax at Import Stage:

In order to tap the true potential of income tax at import stage and to check under declaration by importers, the Board is proposed to be empowered to **notify minimum** value for calculation of tax at import stage.

7. INCREASE IN RATE OF DEFAULT SURCHARGE DUE TO LATE PAYMENT

At present the default surcharge rate is 12% per annum which is significantly lower than the interbank rate and the low rate is a hindrance in recovery of tax arrears. It is therefore proposed that the default surcharge rate be increased to KIBOR rate plus 3% per annum.

STREAMLINING MEASURES:

- 1. AOPs with turnovers of Rs. 300 million or more would need to submit audited financial statements to discourage misuse and promote transparency and non-compliance would render members' share income taxable.
- 2. An explanation is added to the effect that super tax is leviable on banking companies for tax year 2023 and for subsequent years.



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CHRONICLE EVENTS & MEETINGS

DURING 2023-2024

Various meetings were held with respective organizations and Government authorities concerned during my Chairmanship, outcome of these meetings are as follows:

01.TDAP & SBP Organized Awareness Session for Exporters ON 02.11.2023

Mr. Fazalur Rehman Shaikh, Vice Chairman, PTA and Mr. Muhammad Ali, Secretary General, PTA attended the awareness session for exporters as organized by TDAP in collaboration with the State Bank of Pakistan on 02.11.2023 at TDAP Headquarter, Karachi and through ZOOM as well for maximum participation of the exporters under Topic "Exporters Facilitation-Interaction with State Bank of Pakistan". About more than 150 exporters attended this training session in TDAP.

The objective of the training was to create awareness among the exporters about the initiative being taken by SBP to facilitate the exporters. The targeted session was focused on: SBP's Export Facilitation Desk & its complaints redressal mechanism; making import payments through Non-Resident Accounts (NRA's); and facilitation of payments via Asian Clearing Union (ACU).

02. PTA DELEGATION MET DIRECTOR-IOCO ON 21.11.2023

PTA's Delegation led by Mr. Muhammad Shafi, Sr. Vice Chairman, PTA accompanied by Mr. Amanullah Aftab, Mr. Hamid Zahur, Mr. Saad Anis and Mr. Muhammad Ali, SG-PTA met Director, IOCO, Mr. Ashraf Ali at Custom House, Karachi on 21.11.2023 to discuss all related matters specially working sheet submitted to them in July 2023 for finalization. During the meeting is was decided by the Director-IOCO that New Survey of tanneries in Punjab (North) and Karachi (South) to be conducted by IOCO Survey Team for determination of updated prices of Hides & Skins.

Accordingly IOCO team conducted Survey of following PTA's members manufacturing Units for determination/ Revision of Duty Drawback Rates of Export of Finished Leather:

i. Hafiz Tannery, Karachi

- Cow, Buffalo and Upholstery Leather

ii. Royal Leather Industry Ltd., Lahore - Sheep & Goat Skins

iii. Saddig Leather Works

- Cow, Buffalo for wet blue of finished leather

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PTA delegation Meeting with Mr. Ashraf Ali, Director IOCO on 21.11.2023

03. Meeting of PTA with Belarusian Businessmen arranged by the Belarus Embassy in Karachi through ZOOM:

Mr. Muhammad Ali, Secretary General attended ZOOM meeting as organized by the Belarus Embassy, Karachi in on 6th February'2024 for interaction with the stakeholders of Leather Industry of Pakistan and Belarus under topic "Pakistan Belarus Bilateral Cooperation Tanner Sector" which was successfully conducted with the key note to enhance bilateral finished leather trade between both the countries.

04. CHAIRMAN, PTA ATTENDED ZOOM MEETING ARRANGED BY FPCCI ON 24.06.2024 TO DISCUSS ANOMALIES OF BUDGET 2024-25:

Mr. Muhammad Mehr Ali, Chairman, PTA attended Meeting organized by FPCCI on Zoom on 24.06.2024 to discuss anomalies of Budget 2024-25 and decided to take-up with the Government to change the proposed shift from one percent turnover-based Final Tax Regime (FTR) to the standard taxation at 29 percent of taxable profit.



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05. CHAIRMAN, PTA ATTENDED ZOOM MEETING ARRANGED EDF ON 28.08.2024 TO DISCUSS PTA'S PROPOSALS FOR 75% SUBSIDY FOR LWG CERTIFICATION & 50% ON ETP

Mr. Muhammad Mehr Ali, Chairman, PTA and Mr. Muhammad Ali, Secretary General, PTA attended Meeting held by EDF, Ministry of Commerce Islamabad through on Zoom Link on 28.08.2024 to discuss for PTA's proposals for granting 75% subsidy for Rs.621.42 Million for getting registration of PTA's member Exporters of Finished Leather & Leather Products into Leather Working Group (LWG), UK and 50% Subsidy amounting to Rs. 900 Million for Sitting-up of Effluent Treatment Plants in Individual Tanneries.

Pending issues:

I would like to summarize hereunder some core issues of the Leather Industry which need constant follow-up during the next year term 2024-25 too for the facilitation of PTA's members:

- 01. To restore the Final Tax Regime (FTR) on export income to undue burden on exporters and rejected the proposed shift from one percent turnover-based Final Tax Regime (FTR) to the standard taxation at 29 percent of taxable profit, proving to be disastrous for the exports.
- 02. Restoration of Reduced Tariff for Electricity & Gas prices to the Five Export-oriented Industries including Leather Sector of Pakistan, which is halted from March'2023.
- 03. Restoration for DLTL Scheme with inclusion of Finished Leather with all 6 H.S. codes @ 5% irrespectively, which was discontinued from July 2021, which is desperately required by Leather Industry of Pakistan for which preparation work has been completed and pending @ MOC for finalization for issuance of Notification.
- 04. Release refund claims of Sales Tax, Duty Drawback & Income Claims to the Exporters of Leather Industry without further delay, which is real impediments for the Cash Flow facing by the exporters and piled up in huge at Sales Tax & Customs Collectorates & SBP for the release thru automated system to our member bank accounts directly.
- 05. 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

Advance income tax

PTA urges PM, minister to revise proposed insertion

RECORDER REPORT KARACHI: Chairman. Pakistan Tanners Association (PTA), Muhammad Mehr Ali has appealed to the prime minister and federal finance minister to revise the proposed insertion of advance income tax to retain the regular practice which is in progress for the last several years for 1% final income tax adjustment to the exporters to save the exporters of Pakistan from further deterioration.

Deriving income from exports have to pay 1% tax at present on their export proceeds which is final tax. On the principle of horizontal equity that taxpayers with equal income should pay equal tax, for which it is proposed income from exports be subjected to normal rates with one percent tax collection on their export proceeds be treated as minimum tax.

It would really be detrimental to the leather industry of Pakistan for compliance while the existing 1% income tax adjustment against the total income of the exports is resulting best source of generating the fixed amount for the government kitty at final conclusion of final adjustment and the exporters of the industry are defraying regularly.

The cost of the production in Pakistan for leather industry is already at exorbitant extent as compared to neighbor competitors specially with basic utilities as compared below and the exports of leather sector of Pakistan is already in severe clutches of declining for the last 3 years consecutively, which was concluded for July-23 to April, 2024 with current plight of the industry is in negative (-) 19.60% for finished leather & amp; overall section is also stands in negative (-) 10.21% and accordingly further taxation on exporters will be last nail on coffin of exports and apprehended inability to achieve the desired objective(s).

Tanners urge govt to cut tax burden for survival

KARACHI: Pakistan Tanners' Association (PTA) Chairman Muhammad Mehr Ali has said that the additional burden of taxes and duties in the budget has put the industry on the verge of collapse, thus jeopardising future exports.

He said the government had imposed a 2 per cent additional customs duty (ACD) on importing key raw materials and vital chemicals and a 5pc regulator duty on various items, making it difficult for the industry to survive.

He said the industry had been facing an acute shortage of liquidity as refunds of Rs2.5 billion were stuck on account of sales tax. duty drawback claims, and other taxes, thus creating problems for exporters to continue their operations.

He said the imposition of an additional 29pc tax by withdrawing the previous 1pc has created a survival issue for not only tanneries but also for the entire export-oriented industries.

Meanwhile, Korangi Association of Trade and Industry President Johan Qandhari stressed need to provide facilities to exporters to achieve Prime Minister Shehbaz Sharif's ambitious \$60bn export target over the next three exports, it is essential to reduce the cost of produc-tion, especially the prices of electricity, gas, and the interest rate," he stated.

The persistent issue of delayed refunds from the Federal Board of Revenue (FBR) has exacerbated the challenges faced by indus-trialists. "The Prime Minister has called for the release of refunds, but the delay in payments by the FBR continues to increase difficulties for the indus-trial sector," he noted.



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EXPORT & TAXES STANDING COMMITTEE

- On persistent follow-up with the Director IOCO for up-ward revision of Duty Drawback Rates on Finished Leather, finally the IOCO team conducted Survey in Tanneries at Karachi for Goat & Sheep Skins and Cow & Buffalo Hides (Upholstery & Buffalo Upper & Lining) located in Karachi.
- Constantly taken-up with the Ministry of National Food Security & Research and PSW for withdrawal condition of Quarantine Certificate on export of Finished Leather. Recently, the Ministry of Commerce assured for its removal.

- Due to hectic efforts of PTA, subsidy on International Leather Fairs has been increased by TDAP from 40% to 70% for participation of PTA's member exporters in allocated Fairs.
- Requested the Government for immediate "Restoration of regionally competitive Tariff on supply of Electricity & Gas" to Leather Industry ".

Value added Leather Industry is already deprived of even level playing field to compete in the region after discontinuation of Duty Drawback on Local Taxes & Levies (DLTL), Regionally Competitive energy tariffs and levy of multiple taxes, resultantly the exports of Leather Sector dropped by 8.87% from US\$ 887.104 Million to US\$ 808.422 Million during financial year July-June 2023-24.

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HIDES & SKIN IMPROVEMENT STANDING COMMITTEE

The Hides & Skins Improvement Standing Committee of PTA is headed by Mr. Agha Saiddain this year too for further research for availability of best quality of Hides & Skins for the Leather Industry's manufacturers-cum-exporters.

Before commencement of Eid-ul-Azha he met DCO Lahore and Livestock Department, Lahore and discussed for smooth collection of hides and skins by the traders concerned having authority letters of tanners and skin/hide merchants and requested for wide publicity amongst general people to save the precious raw hides & skins from damages and cuts during sacrifice and prevent from heat.

The Punjab Government fully support his proposal and published through media and publicity material for the awareness of general public how to save skins from damages alternatively to save huge amount for the country on the eve of Eid festival.



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




EXPORTS PERFORMANCE OF LEATHER & LEATHER PRODUCTS

FROM PAKISTAN DURING JULY-JUNE 2023-2024 vis-à-vis 2022-23

The export of Leather and Leather Products for the financial year July-June 2023-24 touched US\$ 808.422 Million as against the performance of US\$ 887.104 Million in the corresponding period of last year and registered declined by 8.87% which gives an alarming signal.

The export of Leather Sector has fallen due to various factors such as, duties and taxes imposed by the Government in the recent Federal Budget 2024-25, withdrawal of Regionally Competitive Energy Tariff (RCET), discontinuation of DLTL Scheme @5% for Finished Leather, high-interest rate stuck-up of sales tax refund claims, pending release of duty drawback claims etc. etc.

During the fiscal year July-June 2023-24 about 10.223 million square meters of Finished Leather was exported to Hong Kong, Italy, China, USA, Vietnam, Korea, Germany, South Africa, Bangladesh, Spain, Turkey, Indonesia, Poland, Portugal, Thailand, U.A.E., Saudi Arabia, France and some other countries showing marginal increased in Volume by 1.40% and downfall in Value by 17.91% while the other sectors including Leather Garments exports posted a negative growth to US\$ 249.247 Million in the financial year 2023-24 as compared to US\$ 280.844 Million in the corresponding period of last year and registered decline by 11.25%, Leather Footwear exports showing downward trend by 12.07% and other leather manufacturers registered declined by 11.55% while the Leather Gloves export registered positive trend by 0.66% in value reaching at US\$ 283.157 Million.



NATIONAL INSTITUTE OF LEATHER TECHNOLOGY (NILT)

The prestigious National Institute of Leather Technology (NILT) basically established in 1998 by PTA in financial collaboration of TDAP is now being managed under the independent Board of Governors. This institute housed in a splendid building in Korangi Industrial Area imparts technical and scientific training to the students as well as to the in-service technicians to enable them to serve the tanning, leather sector industry proficiently. Most of the members on the Board of Governors of NILT are from Pakistan Tanners Association who have been contributing their tangible share to make it a state of the art institute aimed at upgrading qualitatively all the leather sectors to be competitive in the world market.

The National Institute of Leather Technology (NILT) is having a qualified faculty team to keep leather industry abreast with modern technology and practices as well as to provide a platform for human resource development. NILT was set up as an institute on national level of an international standard. This institute is planning to upgrade its status which needs full financial support from the Government.

NILT is affiliated and recognized by Sindh Board of Technical Education and Internationally by University of Northampton U.K. Presently Academic courses of DAE (3 Years), Executive Diploma (1 Year) and BBSYDP course (6 Months) are continued at theinstitution.

COMBINED EFFLUENT TREATMENT PLANT (CETP)

The Combined Effluent Treatment Plant (CETP) for Korangi Tannery Cluster in Sector 6-C, Korangi Industrial Area, Karachi was set up with the cooperation of Ministry of Commerce, Government of Pakistan, Dutch Government, Government of Sindh, City District Government and PTA (Southern Zone).

The main objective of the CETP running under its President Mr. Gulzar Firoz is to benefit tanning community at Korangi Cluster, general public, marine life as well as to meet National Environmental Quality Standards (NEQS) which is mandatory and to meet international compliances.





#### **ACTIVITIES OF THE ASSOCIATION**

A short summary of the activities of the Association during the year 2023 – 2024 is given hereunder:

#### MEETINGS OF ZONAL EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE

The Zonal Executive Committee held two (02) meetings during the year in report. Last and third meeting had to be scheduled with the Annual General Body Meeting, which has been scheduled to be held in accordance with the Memorandum and Articles of Association on 12th September 2024.

This year participation of Members and Special Invitees of the Executive Committee was not very active. Factors need to be considered for improvement so as to make effective decision making, deal with day to day affairs and resolution of problems of the industry. Participation would be a healthy sign for industrial growth and members will feel more satisfied with the Association and its functions. I must suggest adopting necessary measures to maintain and improve members' interest in the affairs of the Association and Leather industry.









#### **Central Managing Committee Meetings**

Elected representatives of PTA from Northern Zone made active representation in the Central Managing Committee of PTA by attending meetings held at Karachi/Lahore through video conferencing system and on Zoom Application as well. In this connection, PTA Northern Zone remained co-host for all sessions of Central Managing Committee meetings held simultaneously at PTA Offices Lahore and Karachi.

4th Stakeholders Consultation Workshop on Revision of Industry Specific Punjab Environmental Quality Standards for Tanneries and Leather Sector held on 14-Sep-2023

M/s IES and Punjab Environment Protection Department, Government of Punjab in collaboration with World Bank are working on project "Development of Industry Specific Punjab Environmental Quality Standards for Tanneries and Leather Sector".

In this regard, M/s IES arranged the 4th Consultation Workshop of relevant stakeholders at a local hotel in Lahore. Main objective of consultation meeting is to discuss and collected feedback on proposed set of leather industry EQS.

Stakeholders from various public and private sector attended the session. Mr. Agha Saididain and Ch. Zulfiqar Hayat along with Secretary PTA-Northern Zone attended the meeting.

Everyone got the opportunity to discuss and explain the status of compliance against the proposed environmental quality standards.

Proposed set of EQS for Leather Tanneries were shared during discussion for comments. The standards proposed for tanneries in Punjab were just in line with what PTA-NZ had proposed to the department as Association office kept on following the department vigorously and sent its timely input and feedback to the consultants. Mr. Agha Saiddain and Ch. Zulfiqar Hayat deliberated their opinions and the difficulties that leather sector viz during the pursuit of environmental preservation and compliance of environmental quality standards. However, other sectors present strongly opposed to accept the proposed standards for their sector. It was decided that all sectors will be approached again individually and asked for their respective inputs. In this regard, PTA-NZ was approached again in October 2023 along with proposed set of standards. We forwarded our comments on the draft set of Industry Specific Environmental Quality Standards – PEQS with in due time.





#### Visit of Delegation from ITU Computer & Software Engineering Department

On 30th October 2023, a delegation from IT University lead by Prof. Dr. Usman Younis, Chairperson Computer & Software Engineering Department visited the Pakistan Tanners Association (PTA – Leather Sector) to have meeting followed by presentation to strengthen University-Industry Partnership & Technology Transfer initiatives. Leather sector is the second biggest manufacturing sector in Pakistan after Textile sector. ITU team leader presented some their solutions for automation in the industry, including M/s SRC (pvt.) Ltd.

ITU delegates were interested in building relationship with industry in order to develop customized solutions for the manufacturing industries for industrial automation, preventing failures and break downs. ITU team also proposed for signing MoU between ITU & PTA to benefit the industry and academia to promote the Knowledge economy agenda. PTA has always facilitated academia. Under proposed MOU, PTA will facilitate ITU students to establish technology linkages with industry and coordinate for fruitful collaboration for its member industries.

The initiative later matured on signing of an MOU between PTA and ITU on the occasion of Networking Dinner after Pakistan Mega Leather Show 2024 at Faletti's Hotel, Lahore.



#### Meeting with Minister for Agriculture Regarding Export Facilitation

On April 3rd, 2024, Honorable Provincial Minister for Agriculture, Government of Punjab Mr. Syed Hussain Kirmani called on a meeting of stakeholders from Meat and Dairy Processors sectors regarding export facilitation.

Secretary PTA-NZ attended the meeting. He drew the attention of the forum on hides and skins problems and proposed the following measures:

- 25% exports of hides and skins could enhance by addressing the livestock diseases including LSD, Foot & mouth Disease and mishandlings during butchery and transportation.
- Need to develop statistics on slaughtering of animals including the slaughtering during Eid
- Slaughtering areas may identified/proscribed to streamlines the tanneries business, further mechanical slaughter houses be establishes and increased instead of manual slaughtering practices.









#### Meeting with Secretary Livestock & Dairy Development Department

A follow-up meeting on the above issues was fixed with Secretary Livestock on April 25th, 2024. Following members visited the Secretary Livestock Mr Masoud Anwar in his office:

Following problems being faced by the Industry were discussed with the Secretary:

- Dependency of the Leather Industry:
- Shortage of Material:
- Quality Decline:

Despite the potential of high quality Hides & Skins of qurbani as it's great opportunity for leather industry to cater its approximately 60% annual need, but unhygienic and unprofessional slaughtering during Eid-ul-Azha by unskilled butchers, badly affects Hides and Skins of sacrificed animals, and this material goes in vain when untrained butchers slaughter the animal and put a lot of cuts and deep scratches on the skins which destroy its value.

Mishandling of these precious skins is another major drawback. From Slaughtering point to tannery there are many stages where these skins are collected and mishandled, not timely salted, placed in plastic and polypropylene bags, inadequate ventilation which consequently cause degradation of Hides & Skins.

The delegation also proposed solutions to the above problems.

Secretary Livestock promised to look into the matter and call another meeting on the same issue with PTA members.









#### **Monthly Market Quotations**

PTA-NZ office had been providing to the Central Office, Karachi, the Monthly Market Prices of W.S Buffalo hides and W.S Cow hides indicating the rates of various grades, selection and sizes i.e Extra large, large, medium and small. It has become a regular feature to arrange market rates of above-said commodities for publication so that our members should remain in touch with the prevailing prices of the market. For the past few months the practice has been discontinued as the Secretariat could not retrieve the desired information from the market sources. We look ahead to resolve the matter and seek cooperation from President Lahore Hides and Skin Merchants Traders Group for the same.

#### Meeting with National Productivity Organization/Green Climate Fund GCF

In October 2023, a delegation from National Productivity Organization (NPO) and Green Climate Fund GCF visited PTA-NZ Office, comprising of Engr Asad Mahmood Energy Export/Lead Consultant, Dr. Rakhshinda Perveen, Gender Expert, Dr. Jawwad – Green Climate Fun and Engr. Usman from National Productivity Organization.

Chairman PTA-NZ Mr. Fazalur Rehman Shaikh, along with Mr. Agha Saiddain, and Mr. Naeem Akhtar represented PTA during the meeting:

During the discussion, Engr Asad informed that they are working on Feasibility Study for Enhancing Green Export Capacity. He informed that the team is working on assessment of technology and processes in the industry, and GHG estimation in textile leather, surgical instruments and rice sectors with financial structuring for green financing. The proposed feasibility study would also require environmental and social impact assessment, gender assessment, and gender action planning for the upcoming programme.

Mr. Agha Saiddain responded that at present industry is facing the consequences of financial instability on-going in the country. Dollar price, that been brought down, has to rise eventually. Hence, industry is reluctant in making newer investments.

Dr. Rakhshinda, while explaining her role as Gender expert pointed out the concern of donors and financiers for equal proportionate gender involvement in the sector receiving contribution.

Mr. Saiddain informed that duty heavy work and foul odor, women workforce do not prefer to serve in tanyard and beam house in tanneries. Mr. Naeem Akhtar updated that females are encouraged to work in hair sorting, trimmings, cutting, stitching, packing sections. He informed that in his factory, they are preferring lady workers who believe to be more reliable and dutiful on the work floors.

Towards the ends, Mr. Agha suggested that Pakistan's contribution in GHGs is comparably negligible. Therefore, the feasibility should consider trade of carbon credits with Pakistan on interest-free basis.

The visiting delegation ensured to incorporate the suggestion received during the discussion.



# Two-days International Conference on "Sustainable Textile and Leather Supply Chains-Closing the Loop" organized by WWF-Pakistan

On 15 November 2023 WWF-Pakistan ILES Project arranged an international conference on "Sustainable Textile and Leather Supply Chains-Closing the Loop".

It was a two day's event aimed to provide a platform for industry leaders, experts, and stakeholders to come together and discuss strategies for achieving a circular economy in the textile and leather supply chains.

Conference covered a wide range of issues including:

- Driving Sustainability & Circularity in Supply Chains
- Business Case for Sustainability
- Extended Producer Responsibilities
- Compliance with International Environmental Standards
- Addressing Footprints
- Shaping the Future of Fashion
- Governance and Regulatory Frameworks

Mr. Agha Saiddain Ex-Chairman PTA was especially invited as an Expert Panelist to represent and explain the viewpoint of PTA as an Industry Association taking up the collective challenge and responsibility of sustainability and compliance.

Ch. Zulfiqar Hayat Chairman LEPC was also amongst of the panelist in the discussion on Sustainability in Leather Sector.

Along with various textile Industries, Mr. Abdullah Cheema presented the case of Leather Field (pvt.) Ltd., Sialkot.













### Visit of German Delegation for Fact Finding Mission on German Due Diligence Act & European Green Deal

A delegation from Germany Importers' Association and Sequa comprising of Dr. Michael Arretz Managing Director. VFI e. V. German Importers, Ms. Bettina Müller Project Director, SEQUA and Mr. Christian von Mitzlaff Supply Chain Due Diligence Consultant visited the office of PTA-Northern Zone in August 2024. Mr. Sarim Mehmood, Local Consultant also accompanied the visiting delegation

Dr. Michael Arretz introduced his project which proposes raising awareness amongst members of PTA on Green Deal and Due Diligence Act in order to enable members/exporters to supply high-quality products to German and European markets after understanding the legal requirements

Mr. Agha Saiddain informed the delegation more than 50 leather manufacturing and exporting houses of Pakistan have successfully subscribed LWG Gold membership. He also apprised the delegates on various compliance requirements, at present being confronted by the leather sector of Pakistan including LWG, REACH, ZDHC and customers' certifications.

Mr. Muhammad Musaddiq shared his experiences of having business in Germany and Europe. He informed that Siddiq Leather Works has not faced any difficulty in exporting to Germany and is eager to learn more on the newly promulgated law in Germany ie Due Diligence Law. He endorsed Mr. Agha Saiddain and reiterated the need for reducing the requirements in order to make business/suppliers easy for the entrepreneurs in Pakistan.

Mr. Muhammad Ali, from his side shared the detail of import and export figures for Pak-German Trade comprising of last 3 years. He focused his discussion that a lot of margin exists on both sides to exploits trading potential.

Chairman PTA-NZ told that in PTA Lahore office Secretary PTA-Northern Zone will be the focus person to receive and share further details on the proposed program. We will continue to look forward to enter fruitful collaborations in future.











Visa Recommendatory Certificates/ Letters

During the year under report, we have been issuing recommendatory certificates/ letters to our members or to their representatives, on the receipts of their formal request for the same, and requesting the Foreign Embassies – Consulate Generals for the grant of visa facilities to visit their countries for business tour to explore the possibilities for development of export trade. Generally these letters/ certificates are issued after thorough scrutiny.

#### Correspondence

The incoming queries have promptly been responded to and the problems of the members brought into the notice of the concerned authorities. Besides correspondence with the Government departments, Semi-government, other agencies, the Association also remained in touch with the Central Office at Karachi.

#### Finance

The Statement of Accounts for the year 2023-2024 is presented before the house for its perusal and approval.

It was another difficult year in terms of finances. We remained short of funds despite making several efforts to generate funds. We made to arrive at the close of this year by the grace of Allah. We have prepared a thorough plan to counter the financial difficulties and to bring out the Secretariat from hardships.

As regard to PTA claim against MCB, PTA-NZ has approached the Civil Court through Mr. Agha I.A Imran Advocate who has been pleading the case at different forums earlier. It is pertinent to mention here that the Executive Committee has already decided to offer 25% of the recovered amount as his professional charges.

Case proceedings were filed in Civil Court in October 2010. Progress on the suit filed against MCB in civil court remained quite slow. Due to non-cooperation of PTA witnesses the court has dismissed the case.

#### Membership
